#### PTO Grants Awarded for 2016-2017

In the course of the school year, the PTO raises money through our membership drive and various events. That's the highly visible part of the PTO. What's less visible is where that money goes. Some goes to fund visiting authors, artists, and musicians, to the supplemental food program, to staff appreciation and retirement events, to free events like the Mud Stomp and the Skating Party, to the MCS community gardens, etc. The bulk of it however goes back to MCS in the form of grants. The PTO awards grants each fall and spring, and every teacher, staff member and parent is welcome to submit grant requests to the PTO Finance Committee. Thanks to the hard work and generosity of our MCS families, we were able to fund over \$6,700 in grants for the 2016-2017 school year.

Thank you to everyone who has supported the PTO and helped to make these grants possible, and a big thank you to our business partners!

#### Garden News & Request for Summer Helpers

Marion Cross has 3 new sets of raised bed gardens along the bus driveway, thanks to wonderful parent volunteers, student helpers, and generous funding from the PTO. We chose to refurbish the former beds to have a sunnier, slug and snail free place to grow veggies. Children have planted tomatoes, carrots, radishes, peas, and nasturtiums. In addition to these, Lisa Holley's third grade class has been raising perennial pollinator friendly flowering plants as part of the Upper Valley Pollinator Project. These have been planted in the center bed. We hope that they will thrive and spread to support the diminishing number of native pollinators in our area. All third grade classes have been learning about pollination. The back garden has been planted by students for Salad Day. Spinach, kale, lettuce, and radishes have been growing since MCS Earth Day, but the weather has not helped the speed of their development! A fifth grade lunch recess garden crew has been working faithfully to keep the plants watered, weeded, and thinned. Thank you to all those who donated time, materials, and heavy equipment to make these garden upgrades possible.
